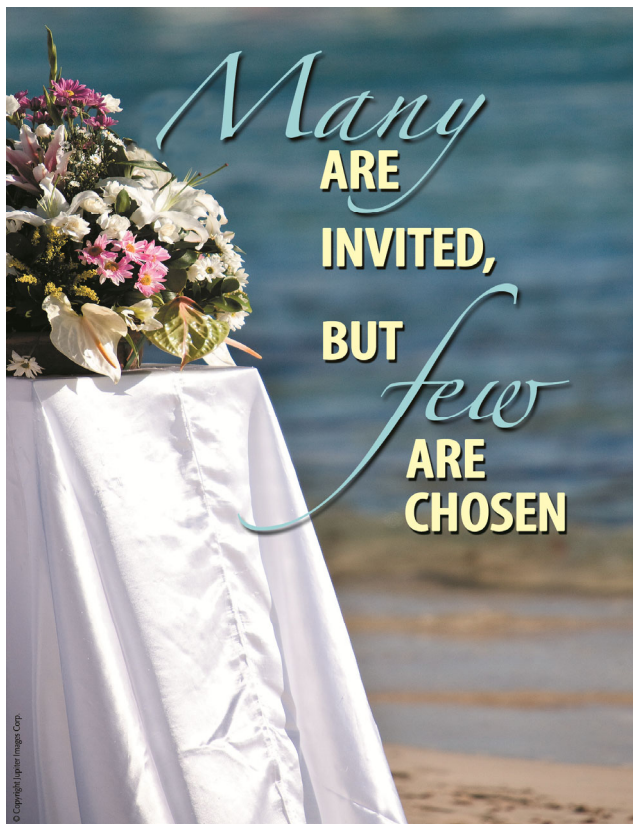

COME TO THE FEAST

"On this mountain, the Lord of hosts / will provide for all peoples / a feast of rich food and choice wines" (Isaiah 25:6). That's what Isaiah tells us today. God is putting together a huge party for "all peoples," to "wipe away / the tears from every face" (Isaiah 25:8).

And what does Jesus tell us? The reign of God, he says, "may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son" (Matthew 22:2). When the guests didn't come, the king had his servants go out "into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find" (Matthew 22:9). We are called to deliver that invitation.

One of the themes woven into today's liturgy is that of divine generosity. Asleep to reality, people often think they have "earned" what they have. In our better moments, though, we know that all our gifts--even the spiritual gifts--come through God's generosity. Our vocation is to invite people, to remind them the tickets aren't for sale. We can only show up and say thank you.

Treasures From Our Tradition

The confessional is a familiar setting in literature and drama. Everyone from Dostoevsky and Shakespeare down the line to Seinfeld has used the sacrament to tragic or comic effect or to reveal aspects of character otherwise hidden. All of this theater, from world classics to slapstick, has had a numbing effect on our own expectations, and has skewed how the culture looks at us and our struggle with sin and forgiveness, hope and healing. Yet the artists are on to something. The reconciliation chapel is a place where hearts are laid bare, where honesty is the watchword, and people confess their deepest needs. It is also a place of rebirth, or at least realignment. It is, like the baptismal font, a place where something dies, and where something else is born. Today, although literature has barely caught up, the place is usually not the dark and gloomy cabinet of old; rather it is a chapel that speaks of peace, serenity, and the comfort of a welcome home. People in one parish were astonished recently to see their children skipping with delight as they left the place of their first confession. We have to wait a bit for world literature to catch up with this reality, but at least we can experience the joy of penance, the thrill of a new beginning, the assurance of God's love.

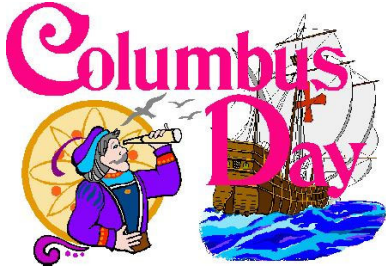

What is 40 Days for Life all about?

It was started in 2004 by 3 people in College Station, Texas who believed that abortion was a moral crisis with a moral answer. They prayed about how they could impact their local pro-life effort and their answer was 40 Days for Life. They chose 40 days because throughout history, God used 40-day periods to transform individuals, communities and the world. It is a three point program consisting of:

Prayer and fasting – the most essential component

Constant Vigil – the most visible component

Community Outreach – the educational component

The campaign spread like wildfire as these three were joined by masses of people that had more energy to pray than to listen to the negativity in the news. In the Fall of 2007, 40 Days for Life went national and now is a biannual campaign occurring in the Spring and Fall in 301 cities in 50 states, Canada, England, Ireland, Brazil, Peru, New Zealand, Spain, Australia and Germany. There have been 4,313 lives reported as spared from abortion, 53 abortion workers have quit and 16 clinics that have permanently closed.

World Mission Sunday, October 19

In his message for World Mission Sunday 2014, Pope Francis reiterated the close connection between evangelisation and joy. In his short message, he mentions the word, 'joy' (or rejoice) at least thirty three times!

The World Mission Sunday is to be a celebration of grace and joy. Evangelisation is a celebration of grace because it is the work of the Holy Spirit and he alone gives wisdom and strength to those who are open to his promptings. It is a celebration of joy because Jesus in whom Christians proclaim to the world, is the 'manifestation of joy'. Jesus not only brings Good News, He is Good News to everyone who encounters him. As such, the Church is called to communicate Jesus Christ to the world joyfully. In order to make this communication effective, it has to be done not only with words but with concrete deeds of love reflecting the heart and compassion of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

Let us Become One Family On Mission! Sharing the Good News with others is the work of all baptized Christians regardless of age! So you and I are encouraged to become aware of how we took up the call to become Missionaries from the day we were baptized. This campaign therefore spurs us to look at the different ways we can carry out our Mission by simply sharing the Joy of Christ in our family, in our community, in our parish and throughout the world!

Can Anyone "Do Mission"?

YES! Strengthened by the Holy Spirit, you can continue Jesus' work to:

- **PROCLAIM** who Jesus is and how He lived, taught, died and rose from the dead. *This is to show who God is, to reconcile people to one another and to God, and to call everyone to the fullness of human life.*
- **INVITE** people everywhere to accept the salvation that Jesus offers by becoming one with Him. *Jesus turns us away from sin and destructive relationships by inviting us to have a right relationship with God and others. We do this when we practice love, mercy, forgiveness, justice and kindness.*

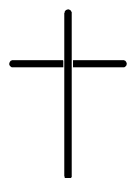

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La Virgen María tiene siglos de estar apareciéndose a los cristianos. Aún antes de que fuese asunta al cielo, ella ya se le había aparecido al apóstol Santiago en Zaragoza, España. Según una antigua leyenda, Santiago llegó a tierra española en el año 40 para predicar el Evangelio. Tuvo poco éxito y desanimado pensaba sacudirse de los pies el polvo de aquella tierra y buscar convertir otras gentes. Mientras estaba en oración, María, la madre de Jesús, se le apareció con palabras de consuelo, ánimo y un pequeño obsequio. Le dio una imagen de ella misma sobre un pilar y con el Niño Jesús en brazos.

En esa tierra ella pidió la construcción de un templo donde ella misma sería altar para la gloria de Dios. Santiago mismo construyó la primera iglesia donde hoy se encuentra una gran basílica en honor de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano. De María vienen los principios del Día de la Raza.
