TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

If the alb is the premier baptismal garment, then why are there so many other styles of vesture in evidence in our parishes? In some places, altar servers and other ministers might wear a garment, usually black, called a cassock. Over that is normally worn a white garment (a "surplice"), reminiscent of the alb but much shorter, often of starched linen and trimmed with lace. The cassock is not a liturgical garment, but a clerical robe. Its origins lie in the religious habit of monks. By the late Middle Ages, diocesan priests and clerics increasingly were encouraged to emulate religious priests. Very small boys were often apprenticed to monasteries, especially for music education, and would be invested with a cassock and sometimes even inducted into the ranks of clerics.

For centuries before the Reformation, it was required that all men entering higher education be clerics, and so the cassock and its variations became familiar academic garb. At the Reformation, many ministers retained a form of the cassock as ordinary dress, rejecting liturgical garments. In the seventeenth century, the English Civil War was in part provoked by the Archbishop of Canterbury's insistence that ministers wear surplices. Although the Episcopal Church now retains "cassock and surplice" as the normal dress for lay men and women assisting at liturgy, Catholics are increasingly attentive to the deeply traditional treasure of the alb, our baptismal robe, when special liturgical vesture is needed.

Respect Life**"Informed" Consent and Abortion**

When you go to the hospital for any medical procedure, you are invariably informed about the procedure, its possible complications, etc. Only then does the patient give "informed" consent.

Abortion is the most frequently performed surgery on adults in America. Yet it is unique in that, while it is surgery that is potentially dangerous to the mother and destroys the human being within her, the mother is not given proper factual information on the surgery, not to mention any details about "what she carries". Indeed, this is one of the most tragic abuses associated with the abortion industry particularly as the abortion clinic has a vested, financial interest to carry out the abortion.

Very little (if any) factual information is given at all, and what is given is often false. The complications are ignored, glossed over, or mentioned on a paper in fine print. The mother's baby is referred to as "pregnancy tissue", "not alive yet", "not a baby yet", "just a bunch of cells", "only a glob". These descriptions are given at a stage of development when the baby already sucks his or her thumb and feels pain, and when we can listen to his/her tiny heartbeat on an office ultrasonic stethoscope.

Such deception of the mother and railroading her into an abortion is never more evident than when the so-called "counselor" asks her, "Do you want your menstrual period re-established? If so, just sign up for this procedure". Abortion is not mentioned, nor is anything said about the baby.

Abortion is a huge industry, providing enormous profits to providers such as Planned Parenthood. There is no better example of the exploitation of women than this continuing, commercialized, and almost universal deception.

Adult Faith Formation and Bible Studies... Mark Your Calendar!

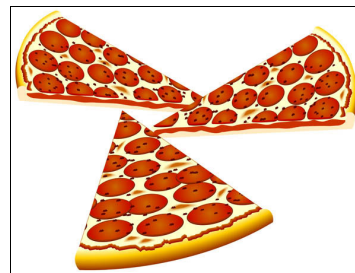

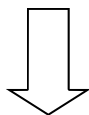

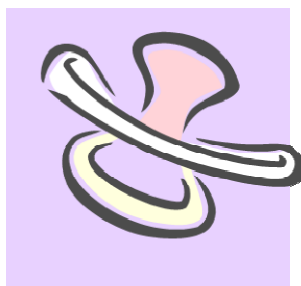

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Según la creencia de los aztecas, toltecas y otros indígenas, los niños y las niñas nacen sin rostro y corazón. Corresponde a la familia formar en ellos y ellas el rostro (la personalidad), y el corazón (ánimo/ motivación) durante los primeros siete años de su vida.
