

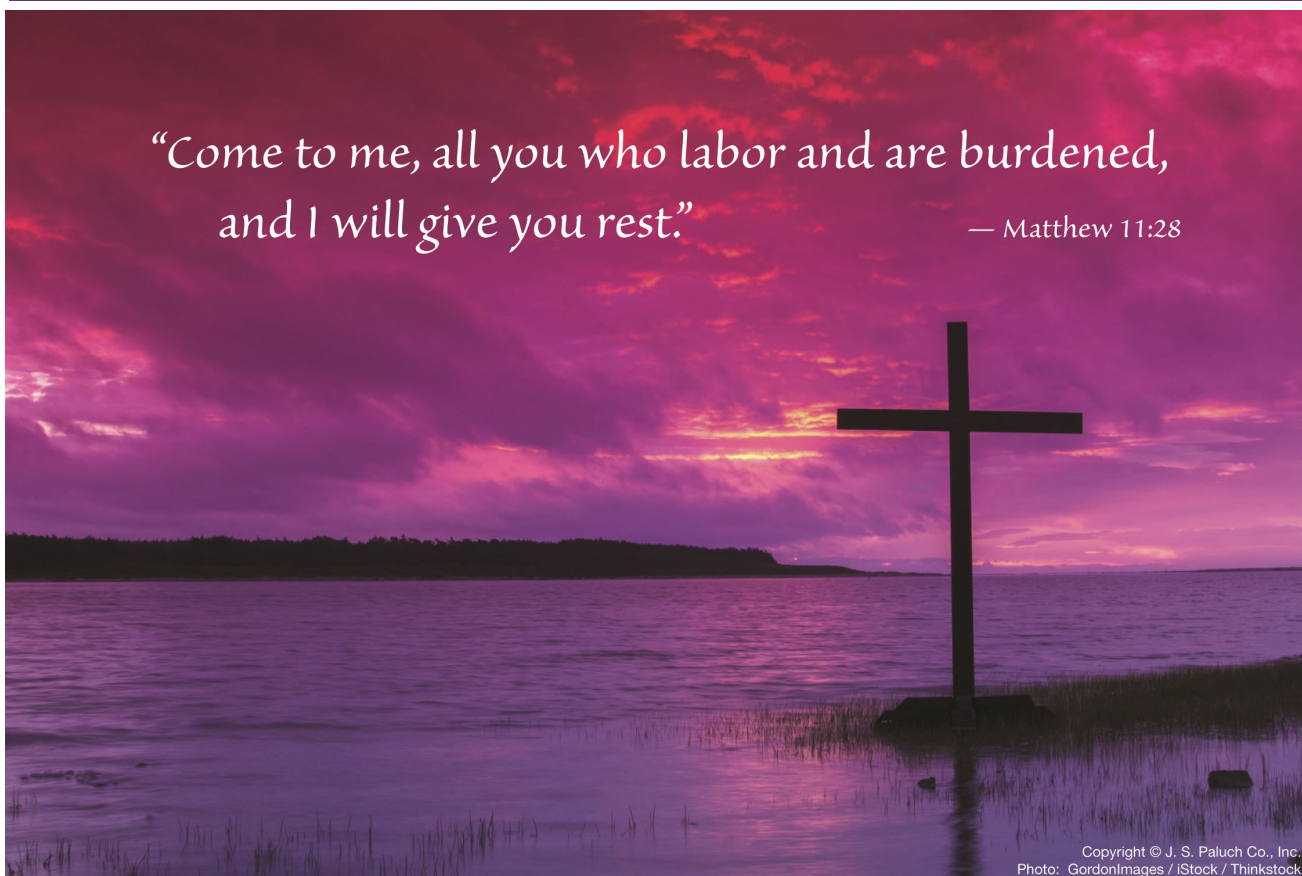

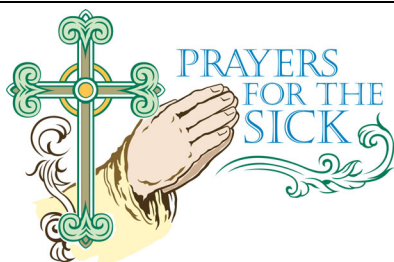

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch of the parish church. The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles. The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath.

Important Research on the Mental-Health Effects of Abortion

The British Journal of Psychiatry has recently released research on the mental-health effects of abortion.

This new analysis offers the largest available body of evidence on the psychological impact of abortion. Overall, it presents a very strong body of peer-reviewed research showing that abortion significantly increases the likelihood of depression, anxiety, alcoholism, drug use, and suicide.

This analysis was both rigorous and thorough, taking into account demographic factors and prior history of mental-health problems. Overall, it is based on 22 published studies and brings together data on 877,181 partic-

ipants, 163,381 of whom had experienced an abortion. Furthermore, its appearance in a top psychiatry journal indicates that it was carefully critiqued and evaluated by respected public-health scholars.

It will be interesting to see how much attention this analysis will receive from the mainstream media. Within the past few years, both the New York Times and the Washington Post have run stories about purported research that allegedly indicated that abortion had little effect on the mental health of women. Furthermore, the mainstream media diligently avoids covering any studies on the harmful effects of abortion. Hopefully, the prestige of the journal, the volume of studies included, and the consistency of the findings will encourage the mainstream media to give a second look to this vitally important issue.

Saint Mary Catholic Church Stewardship Opportunities

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Pt 4:10). "What identifies a steward? Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. But being a Christian steward means more. As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord." *Stewardship To Be a Christian Steward: A Summary of the U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship*

Our Parish is in need at this time of faithful disciples that may use these stewardship opportunities for returning our gifts of time and talent to God. As stewards of God-given skills and abilities, volunteering in a ministry or organization provides a way to thank God, share our faith with others, and enhance our community.

Some of the ministries that are in need of chairs, coordinators and/ or volunteers among many are:
Cantors: Leads the congregation in the Psalm and hymns selected especially during 5:00 pm Saturday Masses.

Choir: We are blessed to have a wonderful choir who rehearse the music for Mass. Some choir members are cantors also. There is room for you too!

Greeters/Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality: What a better way to go to a church and see a smiling, welcoming, gentle face welcoming you. At the door well before Mass begins, greeters welcome people into our church, answer questions (restrooms, special seating for Baptism family, handicap seating, etc.). Encourages people to be seated by locating available pews. Takes up collection and places it in required security bags.

Assistant Sacristans: Watches that the altar and gift table for Mass, ensuring enough hosts, wine and linens are set out. (the last one to sit)

Bringing the Eucharist to the Sick: The ministry of bringing Communion to the homebound, to Living Centers, or to other establishments is a graced act of service that is dearly needed and sincerely appreciated. A variety of opportunities are available.

Safe Environment Coordinator and Members: Churches, schools, and youth organizations must ensure that children and youth who worship, study, or participate in activities sponsored by a parish can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible. Parents and caretakers have the right to ask these institutions if they meet the requirements of the Charter before they allow their children to become involved with them.

Saint Mary Catholic Church Stewardship Opportunities

We need volunteers that will help our church and school to oversee that a code of conduct for clergy and for any other paid personnel and volunteers in positions of trust who have regular contact with children and young people is maintained. Training for all adults who work with children will be offered.

The Respect Life Committee: The person will be knowledgeable in Church teaching on aspects of life from conception to natural death; be able to coordinate the activities of the Respect Life Committee. This person should have a passion for life.

Liturgical Environment Coordinator and Members: remember the importance of the beauty, quality and appropriateness of the place where the liturgy is celebrated and the vessels, vestments and articles used in the various rites. The Coordinator of Liturgical Environment ministers as part of the parish liturgical planning team. This person considers the primary visual and tangible aspects of the celebration of the sacred rites and insure that appropriate vessels, vestments and articles are used. Plans how the visual arts can appropriately be used in a secondary way to enhance the liturgical celebration (e.g. flowers, hangings, seasonal ornamentation, etc.) Assure that the general liturgical environment (arrangement of space, furnishings, lighting, permanent decorations, etc.) corresponds to the aesthetic and ritual vision found in the church's liturgical books.

Wedding Committee Coordinators: assist engaged couples with church related details regarding their wedding. A wedding coordinator will meet with the couple prior to the wedding. The coordinator and the assistant are also present at the rehearsal and one hour prior to the wedding to assist with the organization of the wedding party and other details.

Legion of Mary: Any practicing Catholic who is willing to fulfill the obligations of membership in the proper spirit, attend the weekly meeting, do a minimum of two hours of Apostolic work each week with a partner, recite the Catena Legionis daily. Some of the types of work undertaken are: visitation to establish friendly contact with non-Catholics and/or those Catholics who may not be practicing their Faith, as well as parish families, to foster Catholic devotions such as First Fridays, daily family rosary, missions, etc., visitation of the sick in homes and hospitals, visitation of residents in nursing/assisted living homes, other spiritual works of mercy as needed.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En el año 2001, Carlos Manuel Rodríguez Santiago se convirtió en el primer laico caribeño beatificado por la Iglesia. Su vida fue ejemplar en la caridad y en el amor a la liturgia, pues promovió la participación de los fieles de una manera activa, mucho antes de que el Concilio Vaticano II así lo pidiera. En 1963 una colitis rectal muy severa lo llevó a los brazos de Cristo resucitado, a la edad de 44 años.

Carlitos, como muchos lo llaman, trabajó en la Universidad de Puerto Rico y fundó un grupo apostólico laical en el Centro Católico de dicha universidad. Allí pudo obrar por el desarrollo del humanismo cristiano, la participación activa de los laicos en la liturgia de la Iglesia y por la renovación de la Vigilia Pascual. Solía decir que los cristianos "vivimos para esa noche" como cumbre y centro de nuestra fe. Carlitos es modelo para los laicos comprometidos con su fe. Él insistía no sólo en una participación activa en la pastoral de la Iglesia, sino también en la liturgia de la Iglesia en una época donde la Misa todavía se consideraba obra exclusiva de los sacerdotes.

Importante investigación sobre los efectos de Salud Mental del aborto.

La columna Británica de Psiquiología ha lanzado recientemente los resultados de la investigación sobre los efectos de salud mental del aborto.

Este nuevo análisis ofrece el grupo más grande disponible de pruebas sobre el impacto psicológico del aborto. En general, presenta un cuerpo muy fuerte de investigación que revisados muestran que el aborto aumenta significativamente la probabilidad de depresión, ansiedad, alcoholismo, drogadicción y suicidio.

Este análisis fue riguroso y cuidadoso, teniendo en cuenta los factores demográficos y antecedentes de problemas de salud mental. En general, se basa en 22 estudios publicados y reúne datos sobre los 877.181 participantes, 163.381 de los cuales habían experimentado un aborto. Además, su aparición en una revista de psiquiatría superior indica que fue cuidadosamente criticado y evaluado por respetados eruditos de salud pública.

Será interesante ver cuánta atención recibirán este análisis de los medios de comunicación. Dentro de los últimos años, tanto el New York Times y el Washington Post han publicado noticias sobre la supuesta investigación que supuestamente indica que el aborto tiene poco efecto sobre la salud mental de las mujeres. Además, los medios de comunicación evitan diligentemente cubrir todos los estudios sobre los efectos nocivos del aborto. Espero que el prestigio de la revista, el volumen de los estudios incluidos y la consistencia de los resultados alentará a los medios de comunicación para que den una segunda mirada a este tema de vital importancia.
